Why Choose an Annuity?

An annuity is a long-term contract between you and an insurance company that helps you grow, protect, and manage retirement savings in a tax-advantaged way. Other than pensions and Social Security retirement benefits, annuities are the only way to create protected retirement income that lasts for life.

All guarantees are subject to the claims-paying ability and financial strength of the issuing insurance company.

A beneficiary benefit is referred to as a death benefit in the contract summary.

¹The Lifetime Income Creator benefit fee is 1.00% of the value of the protected payment base, which is deducted from the contract value annually on each contract anniversary. A withdrawal charge and a market value adjustment (MVA) may apply upon a withdrawal. You will never get back less than the guaranteed minimum surrender value.

Customize Your Annuity to Align with Your Goals

It's essential that your financial strategy reflects what's important to you. With Pacific Index Income, there are two ways to allocate your money: Index-Linked Options and a Fixed Account. Work with your financial professional to determine the mix that supports your retirement-planning goals.

Index-Linked Options offer growth based on market returns by linking to the performance of an index. The interest you earn depends on how the index performs and the crediting method you select.

The **Fixed Account Option** offers a fixed interest rate, credited daily.

You can allocate your money to one or more Interest-Crediting Options and utilize different indexes in the Index-Linked Options.

CONTRACT TERM

is the time until you have full access¹ to your contract value with no charges.

INITIAL GUARANTEED PERIOD

is the initial length of time that rates are guaranteed to stay the same.

INDEXES

are tracked to help determine growth in Index-Linked Options.

INTEREST-CREDITING OPTIONS

determine how potential interest is credited and include both Index-Linked Options and the Fixed Account.

With **Pacific Index Income**, you can guarantee your initial rates for a minimum of one year or for the contract term. Both guaranteed options are available on all Interest-Crediting Options.

A contract term is referred to as a Withdrawal Charge Period in the contract.

¹Because annuities are intended for retirement, if you are younger than age 59½, an additional 10% federal income tax may apply on withdrawals. Pacific Index Income combines the certainty found in financial products that offer guarantees with growth potential linked to market-based indexes. **Your money is not directly invested in the market. This means you will never lose money due to market performance.** Work with your financial professional to customize the annuity for your specific needs and goals.

Choose a Contract Term

One of the first things to do when you purchase Pacific Index Income is to select a contract term, which may be based on your retirement time horizon or when you'd prefer to have full access to the contract value if needed before you commence income. It corresponds to the withdrawal charge schedule on page 11.

Select one of three options:

- Five Years
- Seven Years
- Nine Years (for California only)/Ten Years (for all other states)

Select Your Initial Guaranteed Period

Next, you'll select the guaranteed period that determines how long your initial rates are guaranteed. There are two options:

1. Lock in rates for the same period as your contract term: 5, 7, or 10 years (5, 7, or 9 years in California).

2. Lock in rates for one year. Rates are guaranteed for one year and are subject to change upon annual renewal.

Rates guaranteed for the length of the contract term will generally be lower than annually renewable rates; however, you will have certainty that these rates will not change until your 5-, 7-, or 10-year period ends (5, 7, or 9 years for California).

Annually renewable rates will generally be higher than rates that are guaranteed for the the contract term. However, these rates may be adjusted upward or downward each contract year, subject to the minimum rates stated in your contract.

Your financial professional can show you current rates and help you make this decision. After your selected initial guaranteed period ends, all rates will renew annually on the contract anniversary, which is the anniversary of the date your annuity was issued. Rates will never be less than the guaranteed minimums specified in your annuity contract.



Choose Your Indexes

If you use Index-Linked Options, you will select an index. You can choose a different index for each crediting option you use. Six indexes are offered and are described below. The next page outlines which indexes are available with the various crediting options.

S&P 500®

Composed of 500 equity securities of large-cap U.S. companies. You may benefit from the strength of major companies with diversification across sectors.

Invesco QQQ ETF

Tracks the Nasdaq-100 Index®, which includes 100 of the largest nonfinancial companies listed on the Nasdaq. This index is global (U.S. and international) and may offer high growth potential in periods of market expansion.

iShares® Russell 2000 ETF

Seeks to track the investment results of an index composed of small-cap U.S. equities. The smaller companies in this index may deliver higher returns during periods of economic turbulence. The index also provides diversification in that it may perform differently than large-cap and mid-cap indexes.

MSCI EAFE®

Tracks the performance of large- and mid-cap companies across 21 developed markets around the world (excluding the U.S. and Canada). This index provides diversification internationally, potentially reducing risk by balancing across different regions.

Determine Your Interest-Crediting Options

Each Interest-Crediting Option has characteristics that might appeal to different types of investors and are summarized below. This page provides an overview of how the various options work, how they may help your contract value grow, and the indexes available with each. Rates are set at contract issue and guaranteed for your selected initial guaranteed period—1, 5, 7, or 10 years (1, 5, 7, or 9 years for California).

Fixed Account Option

This option guarantees a fixed rate of interest, which is credited daily. After the initial guaranteed period, rates will renew on each contract anniversary. This option gives you the certainty of knowing how much interest will be credited to your contract value. The renewal rate may be higher or lower than the initial rate but will never be lower than the minimum guaranteed interest rate stated in your annuity contract.¹

Point-to-Point with Cap Option

This option is designed to work well in rising or moderate-return market scenarios. Consider this crediting option if you want access to market-like returns but understand that the maximum amount credited is capped at a predetermined percentage.

How It Works: When the index return is positive, interest is credited to your contract value at the end of each index term,² up to the cap rate. If the index return is flat or negative, no interest is credited; the contract value remains the same, and there is no loss.

Cap Rate: This rate is a percentage that determines the maximum amount of interest that can be credited at the end of each index term.

Point-to-Point with Performance-Triggered Rate Option

This option is designed to work well in flat or low-return market scenarios. Consider this crediting option if you like the possibility of turning a zero return into a positive return, and in exchange, are willing to sacrifice some upside growth in positive markets.

How It Works: When the index return is flat or positive, a performance-triggered rate is credited to your contract value at the end of each index term. If the index return is negative, no interest is credited; the contract value remains the same, and there is no loss.

Performance-Triggered Rate: This is a rate that is applied when the index performance is flat (0%) or any positive percentage.

Indexes: ■ S&P 500® ■ Invesco QQQ ETF ■ iShares® Russell 2000 ETF ■ MSCI EAFE®

No interest will be earned or credited to Index-Linked Options on amounts withdrawn before the end of an index term. Rates will never be set below the minimum stated in the contract.

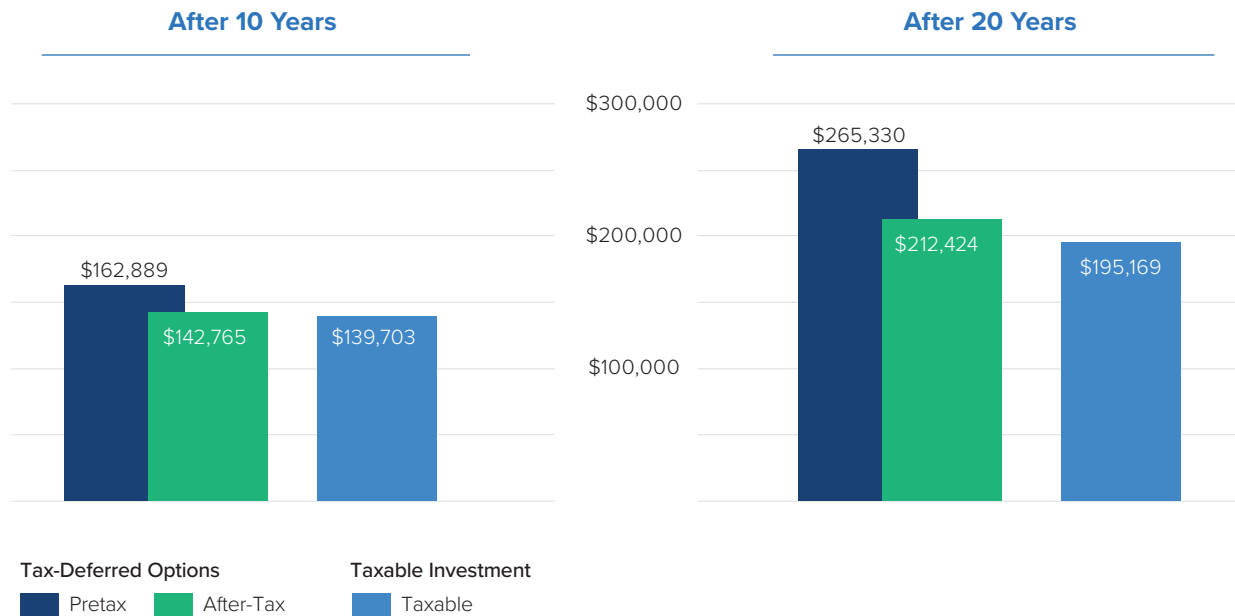

Tap Into the Power of Tax Deferral

Because an annuity is tax-deferred, interest will compound without current income tax. Your money grows faster because you don't pay taxes on the interest earned until you withdraw it or it is distributed to you. The graph below illustrates the benefits of tax deferral.

A \$100,000 initial purchase payment, compounded at 5% annually over 10 and 20 years, grows with taxes deferred. If the full amount is withdrawn after 20 years and taxes are paid on the lump-sum distribution, the amount would be \$212,424—more than the \$195,169 accumulated in a taxable investment over the same time frame.

Tax-deferral assumptions: Hypothetical example for illustrative purposes only. Assumes a nonqualified contract with a cost basis of \$100,000. After 20 years, the full amount before taxes equals the purchase payments plus interest, \$265,330. The amount withdrawn after taxes are paid is calculated by taking the full amount and subtracting the cost basis; it is then multiplied by 0.68 (32% ordinary income-tax rate) and adding back in the cost basis, for a total of \$212,424 after taxes.

Assumes a 32% ordinary income-tax rate, assessed yearly on the taxable investment and at period-end on the tax-deferred example. Actual tax rates may vary for different taxpayers and assets from that illustrated (e.g., capital gains and qualified dividend income). Actual performance of your investment also will vary. Lower maximum tax rates on capital gains and dividends would make the investment return for the taxable investment more favorable, thereby reducing the difference in performance between the examples shown. Under current law, a nonqualified annuity that is owned by an individual is generally entitled to tax deferral. IRAs and qualified plans—such as 401(k)s and 403(b)s—are already tax-deferred. Therefore, a deferred annuity should be used only to fund an IRA or qualified plan to benefit from the annuity's features other than tax deferral. These features include lifetime income and beneficiary benefit options.

Grow and Protect Your Income with Lifetime Income Creator

Pacific Index Income includes a built-in income benefit, **Lifetime Income Creator**, that generates protected lifetime income that increases even if no interest is earned. The amount you can withdraw grows in two different ways.

Automatic Resets

If Interest-Crediting Options generate interest, your lifetime income can increase. That happens when an automatic reset applies, which resets your protected payment base to your higher contract value, even after you start withdrawals under the benefit. The protected payment base is the amount on which your income is based, and when it increases with an automatic reset, so does your income. It is not the same as your contract value and will be reduced if you take early or excess withdrawals. These resets apply for the life of your annuity contract.

- Automatic resets to your protected payment base occur when your contract value is higher than the protected payment base on any contract anniversary. These resets apply for the life of your annuity contract.

Deferral Credits

- Deferral credits will be added to the withdrawal percentage, which determines how much you can withdraw annually, for up to 20 years. This credit is not added to the contract value and is not a rate of return or growth rate.
- The longer you wait to take income in the first 20 years, the more your future income can rise.



Start Withdrawing Lifetime Income

Lifetime Income Creator uses withdrawal percentages and deferral credits that determine how much of your protected payment base you can withdraw each year.¹ That amount is called your “protected payment amount.” These percentages are determined by your age on the effective date of Lifetime Income Creator. Lifetime income withdrawals can start as soon as age 59½. Waiting the full 20 years to take withdrawals maximizes your income.² At purchase, you must choose to cover one life (Single Life) or the lives of you and your spouse (Joint Life). You have the flexibility to change this option when you’re ready to begin taking income.

For Joint Life, deferral credits and withdrawal percentages are based on the younger spouse’s age.

¹All withdrawals under Lifetime Income Creator reduce the contract value in the same manner as any other withdrawal. Early or excess withdrawals may reduce the benefit by an amount greater than the amount withdrawn. Early withdrawals are any withdrawal taken prior to the income commencement date. Excess withdrawals are withdrawals (except for an RMD withdrawal) taken on or after the income commencement date that exceed the protected payment amount, plus any applicable income rollover amount. The income commencement date is the date that the owner elects to begin taking guaranteed lifetime withdrawals under this rider. Early or excess withdrawals, except required minimum distributions (RMDs), are subject to withdrawal charges and market value adjustment if taken during the withdrawal charge period (MVA not applicable in California). Early or excess withdrawals may reduce the benefits provided by Lifetime Income Creator, perhaps significantly, and/or could terminate the benefit if the early or excess withdrawal reduces the contract value to zero. Withdrawals under Lifetime Income Creator also reduce the benefits provided under the beneficiary benefit.

²Once you begin income under Lifetime Income Creator, the percentage you can withdraw no longer grows, but income could increase if an automatic reset applies.

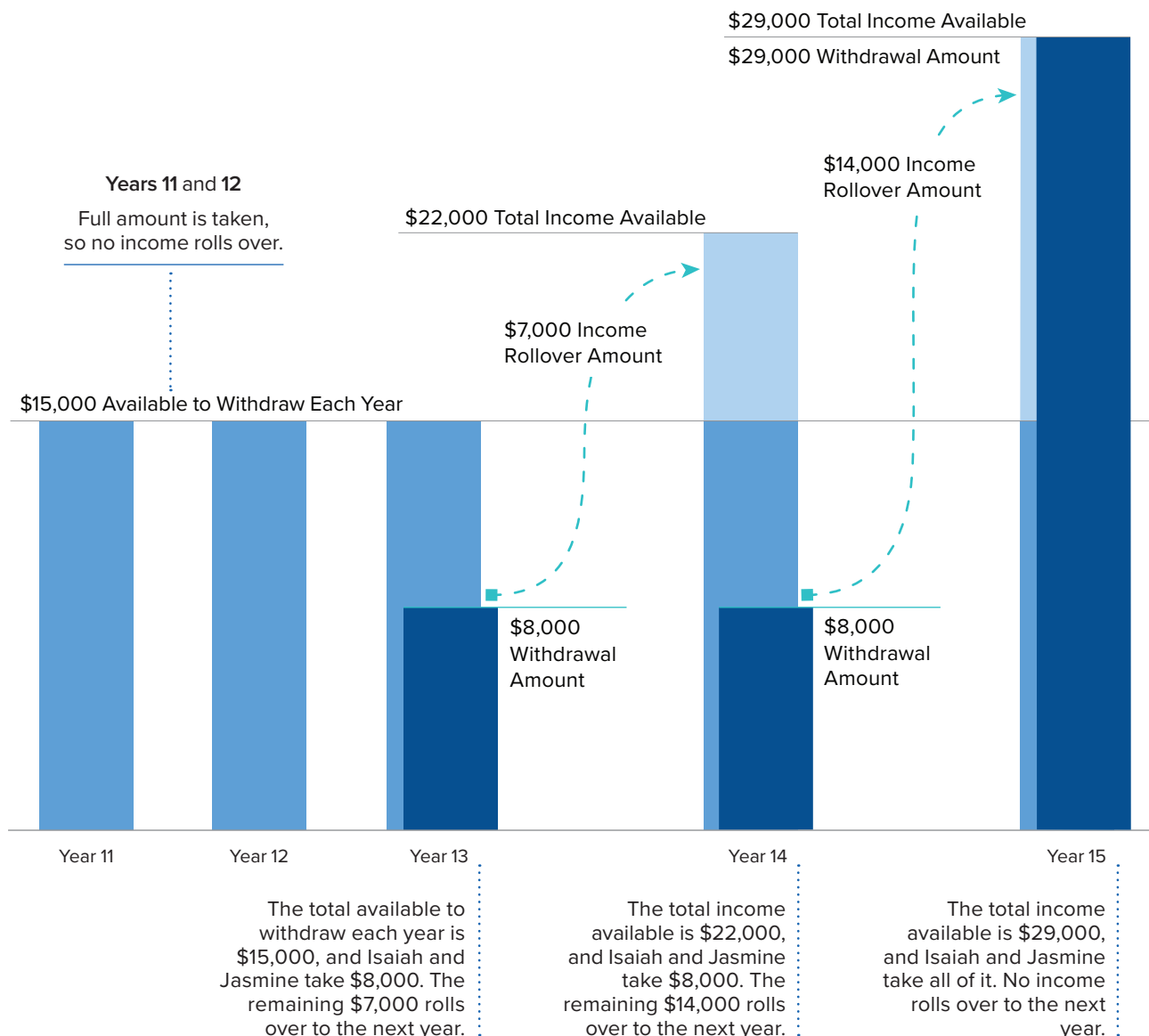
Carry Over Your Income with the Rollover Feature

Income Rollovers

Once you begin taking lifetime income withdrawal payments, the income rollover feature allows the rollover of unused withdrawal amounts from one contract year into the next. If the maximum protected payment amount has not been withdrawn in a contract year, the unused amount (income rollover amount) is carried over to the following contract year.

This can be done over multiple years, but note that the income rollover amount will never be more than the protected payment amount as calculated under this feature.

For example, Isaiah and Jasmine started taking withdrawals under Lifetime Income Creator after their tenth contract anniversary. Two years later, they inherit money after Isaiah's mother passes away. In the next few years, they decide they don't need the full annual protected payment amount of \$15,000 from the annuity contract. They have the flexibility to start rolling over unused amounts that could be used for a vacation, which they decide to take in year 15. The chart below shows how that might look.



For illustrative purposes only. This hypothetical example is intended to demonstrate how the Pacific Index Income with the Lifetime Income Creator Income Rollover feature works. The maximum protected payment amount for Isaiah and Jasmine is \$15,000. They withdraw that amount in years 11 and 12. In year 13, \$8,000 is withdrawn and the balance of \$7,000 is rolled over to year 14. In year 14, a total of \$22,000 may be withdrawn (\$15,000 protected payment amount plus the \$7,000 unused portion from the previous year). Isaiah and Jasmine again withdraw \$8,000, resulting in \$14,000 rolling over for \$29,000 available to withdraw in year 15 (\$15,000 protected payment amount plus \$14,000 rollover amount). They take all the available \$29,000 in year 15. The most Isaiah and Jasmine can take in a year is \$30,000, which is equal to the \$15,000 total withdrawal amount plus the \$15,000 maximum income rollover amount.

Access Your Money

In addition to taking income under the Lifetime Income Creator benefit, other withdrawals are possible.

Full Withdrawals

If you withdraw all your money, you will receive the greater of your contract value minus any applicable withdrawal charges or market value adjustment (MVA), or the guaranteed minimum surrender value. The guaranteed minimum surrender value is equal to a percentage of your total purchase payments (minus any withdrawals) accumulated at an interest rate applicable for the Interest-Crediting Option. These rates are set at contract issue and apply for the withdrawal charge period, after which they are redetermined on each contract anniversary. The redetermined rates will not be lower than the minimum set at contract issue.

Partial Withdrawals

Because you can never predict the future, you have the ability to access a portion of your money when you need it. Withdrawals may begin as soon as 30 days after contract issue and are available through:

- Systematic withdrawals: Withdraw at least \$500 either monthly, quarterly, semiannually, or annually.
- Partial withdrawals: Withdraw \$500 or more at any time.

Because annuities are intended for retirement, if you are younger than age 59½, an additional 10% federal income tax may apply. Withdrawals of taxable amounts are subject to ordinary income tax. For nonqualified contracts, a 3.8% federal tax may apply on net investment income. A withdrawal charge and a market value adjustment (MVA) also may apply.

Withdrawal Charge Period

Withdrawal charges apply only for the withdrawal charge period you select at contract issue—either five, seven, or 10 years (in California: five, seven, or nine years)—and will decrease over time.

Withdrawals will reduce the contract value and the value of the beneficiary benefit, and may reduce the value of the Lifetime Income Creator protected payment base if they are considered early or excess withdrawals. All withdrawal charge periods may not be available at all times, in all states, or offered through all broker/dealers.

Refer to the product fact sheet for more information about MVAs. An MVA will not apply in California.

There are no annual contract, mortality and expense, or administrative fees.

Withdrawals without Charges

You may withdraw amounts up to 10% of your purchase payments in the first contract year and 10% of your contract value during the remainder of the withdrawal charge period (based on your contract value from the previous contract anniversary) without a withdrawal charge or MVA.

Additionally, you may take withdrawals without a charge for the following reasons:

- Required minimum distribution (RMD) withdrawals¹ (only if calculated by Pacific Life).
- Withdrawals after the first contract year if the owner or annuitant is diagnosed with a terminal illness (life expectancy of 12 months or fewer). Not available in California.
- Withdrawals 90 days after contract issue if the owner or annuitant has been confined to an accredited nursing home for 30 days or more, and the confinement began after the contract was issued. Not available in California.
- Annuity income payments. (Available after the first contract year.)
- Beneficiary benefit proceeds.
- Withdrawals taken within the parameters of the Lifetime Income Creator benefit.



¹If there is any change to the Internal Revenue Code or Treasury regulations related to RMDs, Pacific Life reserves the right to modify or eliminate the treatment of RMD withdrawals, subject to regulatory approval, but only to the extent necessary to comply with the change to the rules.

Create the Income You Need

While Lifetime Income Creator grows and guarantees lifetime income, you also can create annuity income payments that last for your lifetime, or the lifetimes of both you and your spouse, by annuitizing your contract. Your financial professional can help you evaluate which option might work best for you.

Annuity Income Payments

After the first contract anniversary, you may convert your contract to annuity income payments for your life, the lifetimes of you and your spouse, or for a specific time period. You may annuitize the greater of the contract value or the guaranteed minimum surrender value. Partial annuitization is not available. Annuity income payments may be received monthly, quarterly, semiannually, or annually. Amounts will differ based on the payout option and period selected. Usually, the longer the payout period, the lower the periodic payment amount. Choose from the following payout options:

- **Life Only**—Periodic payments for life are guaranteed.
- **Life with Period Certain**¹—Periodic payments will be made for life and guaranteed for a minimum period of 5 to 30 years. If you die before the end of the period, your beneficiary will receive the remaining income. If you live longer than the period certain, you will continue to receive the income until you die.
- **Single Life or Joint Life with Cash Refund**—Periodic payments are made for life. If the entire annuitized amount is not paid out prior to your death, the remaining unpaid amount will be paid to your spouse or beneficiary as a lump sum.
- **Single Life or Joint Life with Installment Refund**—Similar to Life with Cash Refund, periodic payments are made for life. If the entire annuitized amount is not paid out prior to your death, the remaining unpaid amount will be paid to your spouse or beneficiary in installments. Please note, this option is not available on qualified contracts, which are contracts paid for with pretax money.
- **Joint and Survivor Life**—Periodic payments are guaranteed over your lifetime (as the primary annuitant) and the lifetime of another person (as the secondary annuitant). The secondary annuitant need not be a spouse.
- **Period Certain**¹—Periodic payments will be made over a specific period, from 5 to 30 years. Other periods may be available.

If annuity income payments begin during an index term, you do not lose out on potential interest crediting for the year in which income payments begin. You may receive an adjusted amount of interest based on the change in index price from the beginning of the term to the time you start income payments.

Converting the contract into annuity income payments terminates Lifetime Income Creator and the beneficiary benefit.

¹For qualified contracts, the maximum length of time for the Period Certain options may be less than 30 years, if necessary, to comply with required minimum distribution (RMD) regulations for annuities stipulated in the Setting Every Community Up for Retirement Enhancement (SECURE) Act.

Leave a Legacy for Heirs

While you're probably focusing on how to enjoy your retirement savings, it's important to think ahead and plan to provide for your loved ones when you pass away. Pacific Index Income includes a beneficiary benefit (also called a "standard death benefit") that can help provide a legacy and may avoid the costs and delays of probate, which means benefits will pass directly to your beneficiaries as long as your estate does not inherit. The benefit is equal to the greater of the contract value or the guaranteed minimum surrender value.

Additionally, should you pass away during an index term, your heirs will not lose potential index crediting. If index returns are positive, they will receive interest that is adjusted for time spent in an Index-Linked Option as of the day Pacific Life receives satisfactory proof of death.

The benefit is not considered life insurance, and taxable amounts are considered ordinary taxable income to your beneficiaries when paid.
